A: To be quite honest, this is a loaded question on my part ! You see, I have been lobbying (since January, '92) the Stamp Advisory Committee, all Advisory Members of Parliament, Provincial Premiers, some 75 AIDS groups nationwide, and the Canadian Hemophilia Society, in trying to persuade Canada Post to Issue a World AIDS Day stamp for December 01, 1994. Decision will be made this fall! Watch for more into in the FALL issue of AIDS on STAMPS.

#### WHAT IS OUR PURPOSE

#### PHILADEMICS

Although the United Nations was not the first to issue stamps related to AIDS, it was through the World Health Organization from the United Nations, that December 01, 1988 was officially declared World AIDS Day! The UN did not commemorate World AIDS Day on a stamp until December 01, 1990 when it issued the three sets of postage stamps illustrated on our front page.

One of the stamps from each of the three issues very colourfully spells out the word AIDS or SIDA in various colours, reminding us that this disease respects no boundaries, including race, creed, or colour.

The 40c New York office issue cleverly depicts AIDS as a black

ray of gloom covering all who may fall in its path.

The s11 Vienna office issue vividiy portrays AIDS being attacked from all sides and by people from all walks of life.

Along with these three sets of stamps was a United Nations Souvenir Card which depicts all three sets accompanied with the following message from Javier Perez de Cuellar, Secretary-General of the UN at that time:

"AIDS cannot be stopped in any one country unless it is stopped in all countries, hence the importance of international solidarity and individual action. Yesterday people were fighting on their own, but today the world is united against AIDS."

Although these words were spoken back in late 1990 when the stamps were issued, the importance of a global effort cannot be stressed enough, in the ongoing battle against AIDS today. We must NEVER become complacent about it.

#### ISSUES A thru Z

ARGENTINA - two stamps on AIDS awareness December 12, 1992. The \$0.10 and \$0.26 values have not yet been assigned Scott numbers at presstime. The \$0,10 value is featured in the FACT OR FICTION section on page 2.

BHUTAN - three stamps (2nu, 5nu, and 10nu) originally issued for International Year of the Child in 1979 have been overprinted World AIDS Day' for issue date of December 01, 1988. Scott numbers 761-763.

BRAZIL - on April 06, 1990, a singk \$ 20,00 value was issued for a campaign of prevention against contracting AIDS. Scott number 2259

BURKINO FASO - a single 1201 value (Scott 873) was issued on April 07, 1989 emphasizing the fight against AIDS worldwide.

<+> Of the nearly 35 sets of stamps issued so far pertaining to AIDS, 14 sets were issued specifically for World AIDS Day, December 01.

<+> On May 23, 1993, at the annual AIDS Candlelight Vigil here in Vancouver, since the last vigil 250 new names were added to the ongoing list of persons known to have died from AIDS.

<+> Canada, the United States, Great Britain, Australia, Sweden, and Japan are just a few of the countries that are affected by, but have yet issued any stamps pertaining to, HIV/AIDS. HOWEVER, it has been noted in Linn's 1993 U.S. Stamp Program: \*AIDS awareness stamp, undetermined date and site."
