

THAILAND'S AIDS STAMP BOOKLET'

Somewhat different from the type of booklet we are used to this Thailand AIDS stamp issue of 19 March 1990 is seen here as a strip of 5 stamps attached to the unfolded cardboard information backing. We show the booklet with the official date of issue cancel on its front, and the mint strip on the inside. The booklets are always flat, never folded. (Scott #1340). 



BANGLADESH RED RIBBON




This AIDS AWARENESS red ribbon cancel was used at Rotapex 94, March 9 - 1994.


BANGLADESH CANCELS


SYRIA (Scott #1373) 23 October 1996 World AIDS Day 1996

This is the second AIDS stamp to be issued from SYRIA. The first was issued (Scott # 1233) on December 24, 1990 to commemorate World AIDS Day 1990.

AIPEX 2000 UPDATE

As we mentioned previously, we have undertaken to expand our lobbying efforts to countries worldwide that have not yet acknowledged AIDS on their postage stamps. In a series of "phases" we contact and re-contact countries from our 'master list' with a goal of convincing or influencing new issues to be adopted before December 01, 2000 (Worlkd AIDS Day).

Following is a listing of the countries we have already heard from after our initial contact in October of 1996. We will continue to keep in touch with them over the next few years as we add other countries to our list. (This information is also available on our website in the form of a reference chart).

PEOPLES CHOICE



POST DENMARK, STAMPS & PHILATELY JOURNAL 3/97 reports that "in third place, with 2,319 votes, was the charity stamp for the AIDS Foundation." (Scott # B81) This was based on a total of 28,678 votes placed overall in the annual opinion poll of Danish stamp issues for 1996.



THE UNITED STATES AIDS Awareness stamp issue of 1993 (Scott #2806) also claimed an award back in 1994. It won the 24th International Asiago Prize of Philatelic Art. This award was given to what a jury found to be the bset stamp of the year from around the world.

CANADIAN STAMP NEWS readers were given the opportunity to play jury to Canadian issues of 1996 which include the Canadian AIDS Awareness stamp. Although the results of this poll are not yet in we are awaiting the results and will make sure our readers know how we faired in our next issue.



ORIGIN OF AIDS QUILT


Although we may not have had the experience of viewing the AIDS Memorial Quilt or panels from it, I'm sure we are all familiar with it. But do we know just how it came about.

I've personally been involved in the actual making of a panel and also had the opportunity to view the Quilt when it was here on display at the XIth International Conference in 1996. Believe me, it is a very emotinal and draining experience; especially when you actually knew so many of the people whose panels you see.

Each panel is a specific size (3 feet by 6 feet) which is by no coincidence, for that is the standard size of a grave. When the gentleman who made the first panel as a tribute to remember his friend decided in this way, he had no idea just how large a project this would turn into. Today panels are made and dedicated all over the world through The NAMES PROJECT which is the organizatin responsible for maintaining the Quilt Displays.



When the panels from the American Quilt were put on display in Washington D.C. from October 11 t hrough 13, 1996 a special US postmark cancel was used (above).



A special cancel was also used when the Quilt was on public display in November of 1994 at Albuquerque, NM.
