




Photo of *THEMATIC Exhibits* Section. Just a small sampling from the 3500 plus frames in the entire Exhibits Sections found in *both* halls!

AIPEX 2000 UPDATE

As part of our visit to PACIFIC 97 we took that opportunity to present to a number of countries on our AIPEX 2000 list directly our Phase I package to them.

Among the countries (or the agents representing them) we touched base with we were able to add 23 countries to our list. These include: Austria, Chile, Costa Rica, Fiji, Gambia, Ghana, Haiti, Indonesia, Israel, Jamaica, Nigeria, Portugal, Malaysia, Nicaragua, Singapore, South Africa, Swaziland, Tahiti-Polynesia, Tanzania, Turkey, French Venezuela, Vietnam, and Zambia. We are now in the process of initiating Phase II follow up with another 15 countries previously contacted in Phase I.

Although its a bit early to expect any response from the recent Phase II contacts, we will be contacting those countries again in the fall as we continue our efforts to have as many countries as possible at least consider the topic of HIV/AIDS in their future stamp issuing programs.

We will keep our readers updated on this project not only through this Newsletter, but we now have this information available on our web site.


AIDS A SUGGESTED THEME
