

# INDONESIA

## 'Children Living in a World with AIDS'

On December 01, 1997, Indonesia adopted the World AIDS Day theme of 'Children living in a world with AIDS' to recognize this tragedy in its homeland. However, it went one step further then most countries by making the stamp a charity stamp (semi-postal) with a surcharge of 100 Rp to go directly to the AIDS foundation in Indonesia. The 700 Rp single stamp features the AIDS solidarity red ribbon.

#### AOS BEGINNING YEAR SIX

"Creating awareness, education and support through a universal medium the postage stamp" continues to be our motto as the AIDS ON STAMPS Project Newsletter begins its' sixth year of publication.

As we start our sixth year of publication we are amazed how time has gone by but look back with pride over the years as we presented our very first issue of the Newsletter in the summer of 1993. Little did we know then how far we would come along and, even more fulfilling, just how much material continues to be added to this topical on a global scale.

In that first issue of 1993 we were able to list stamps issued from a total of 35 countries or postal issueing authorities. With the items mentioned in this issue that number now reaches 67 countries for stamps, not to mention other countries that have used postal cancels of some type or other in recognizing HIV/AIDS in some form.

#### CINDERELLA OR - THE UGLY STEPSISTER?

In our endless quest for completeness have we overlooked one possible neglected child? During my years of searching for as many different elements as possible pertaining philatelically to the topic of HIV/AIDS, several of these little jewels have come my way. The items I am referring to of course are those delightful gems we refer to as **bromides**.

What their role would be in any topical collection I feel is perhaps up to the individual collector themsellf. However, I do feel in the overview of the entire process of the stamp - from being a mere idea, right through to the finished product (stamp), the **bromide** is an intregal link in the entire chain.

Lets take a look at a few samples from our own collection. They come in various sizes, shapes, and forms; colored, and black and white. To illustrate the various shapes and sizes we have reduced the examples 50% to retain their original presentation forms as we received them. In some cases you get the entire set of the stamps (fig.1), while others are singular (fig.2) and some even illustrate a certain element only (fig 3). Others are much larger then the actual stamp size (fig.4)

According to the regulations of the UPU (Universal Postal Union) "member countries are required to submit samples of each stamp issue in some form to all member countries." The bromides are also used as a promotional element as part of press releases about new stamp issues and are sent to worldwide media and study groups for their interest. They usually take the form of an actual photograph of the particular item and are printed on high quality glossy type photographic papers.

Although my searching cannot reveal any direct reference of the word bromide in the ATA Topical Association) Philatelic (American Elements Checklist, I will be bold enough to give these little jewels their choice of a place of honour either under Designs - Artwork or Stamp - Printings. However, I must confess I have yet to include any of these items in a competitive exhibit to the exposure of the juryat-large! But, for now I will treat my bromides as a true Cinderella waiting for the handsome Prince with the famous glass slipper to come along - rather then the Ugly Stepsister, keeping in mind that old bottom line - we collect what we enjoy collecting!

#### 10th ANNIVERSARY OF FIRST AIDS STAMP ISSUE

This fall (September 19) will mark the tenth anniversary of the first AIDS related postage stamps ever to be issued in the world! The set of four stamps was issued by San Marino on the occasion of the International AIDS Congress which was held in San Marino from October 10 to 14 of 1988. A special graphic cancel was also used for that occasion which we illustrate below.



However, the earliest AIDS related cancel we have been able to locate comes from Germany and dates back to 06-5-86 which we illustrate below. If anyone has something earlier we would appreciate receiving a photocopy for our records (or better yet, perhaps one of your spares!)




### DETAILS

Taken from brochures supplied by the various postal administrations we have put together a listing of some of the quantities of stamps printed for certain issues. May be boring to some, but may be of interest to others.

#### 12th WORLD AIDS CONFERENCE June 28 - July 3, 1998

Geneva, Switzerland will be the location for the 12th World Conference on AIDS later this year. The theme of this International Conference is **Bridging the Gap** with a special focus on the "growing gaps between the established market economies in the 'North' ...... and the resource-poor countries of the 'South'.

Based on the reported negative response to the AIDS stamp issued (Scott # 949) by Switzerland in October of 1994 we really don't think that another stamp issue will be forthcoming from that particular Postal Administration. However, stranger things have happened in the wonderful world of philately! We will endeavour to track down any possible cancels, postcards, or other related items arising from this Conference however and share this information with our readers.


### QUARTERLY QUOTE

WALLIS & FUTUNA released this FDC on December 01, 1997 as part of their campaign fo fight AIDS



TURKISH REPUBLIC OF NORTHERN CYPRUS used the same design for their earlier AIDS FDC issue of 1991 only without the red ribbon.
