MACEDONIA - 1998

For the fifth year in a row, Macedonia has recognized HIV/AIDS as part of International World AIDS Day. This miniature sheet of four was issued for use December 01 to 07, 1998. My sources indicate that this may be the last miniature sheet and in future a single stamp only, will be issued for December. To my knowledge there is no imperforate sheet as part of this issue.


SOUTH AFRICA BOOKL

FRANCE dated 1-XII-97 at 28 Chartres for 10th year of Fighting AIDS Worldwide (World AIDS Day).






FRANCE dated 1st dec 97 at 57 Thionville with a smiling face Red Ribbon character.
