MALAYSIA

In June of 1999, Kuala Lumpur hosted the FIFTH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS on AIDS in ASIA and the PACIFIC. This colorful set of three values (30 sen, 50 sen, 1rm) incorporate the global symbol of the Red Ribbon keeping the graphic design clear and to the point with just three simple colors of red, blue, and white. The hearts and joined ribbons (cleverly resembling two persons together on the 50 sen value) emphasize the importance of working together in all efforts towards combating HIV/AIDS.

ISSUES UPDATE A TO Z

MALAYSIA issued the set of three stamps on June 19, 1999 we have featured on our front page in conjunction with the Fifth International Congress on AIDS in ASIA and the Pacific. As yet we have not seen any FDCs but hope to have received at least one in time for our next newsletter issue.

MALI has issued an interesting miniature sheet of four stamps recognizing medical achievements which includes one stamp paying tribute to Dr. Luc Montagnier who is credited with the discovery of the virus that causes AIDS - HIV. The other three issues in the sheetlet include Fleming - discovering penicillin; Albert Einstein - 1921 Chemistry Nobel Prize; and Nelson Mandela - 1993 Peace Nobel Prize. Unfortunately, we do not have a photo of this item yet!





ROMANIA draws attention to AIDS in a recent issue of four stamps focusing on the fight against smoking(400L), alcohol(800L) and drug abuse(1300L), and HIV infection(2500L) with this interesting set. Each of the four stamps carries the message: "SAY NO TO: smoking, alcohol abuse, drugs, and HIV infecting. An interesting set that ties in several elements affecting HIV/AIDS.




This will indeed be a rare opportunity for the serious HIV/AIDS or Medical Topical collectors to acquire a very unique and limited item (or
